

Data by Age Group


Cases by Test Date and Patient Age



OSHA Emergency Temporary Standard

Effective July 6, 2021

- Purpose: Establish requirements to protect workers from exposure to COVID-19 in all settings, with some exceptions, where any employee provides healthcare or healthcare support services.
- Under the ETS, employers must conduct a workplace-specific hazard assessment to identify potential workplace hazards related to COVID-19.
- The COVID-19 plan must address the hazards identified by the hazard assessment and include policies and procedures to minimize the risk of transmission of COVID-19 for each employee.
- Under the ETS, employers must develop and implement a COVID-19 plan for each workplace; the plan must be written if there are more than 10 employees.
- Employers must designate one or more workplace safety coordinators to implement and monitor the plan and ensure compliance with all aspects of the COVID-19 plan.

We will not automatically enter Missourians who have been vaccinated. You must enter separately.

Winner Prizes & Categories

The Missouri Department of Health & Senior Services will partner with the Missouri Lottery to draw 180 winners in 5 randomized drawings who will win either \$10,000 cash or \$10,000 towards an education savings account. In total, the state will award 900 individuals throughout the incentive program.

Red Pool

Missourians 18+

If you are a Missourian 18 years of age or older and received at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine after July 21, 2021, you may register for a chance to win \$10,000 in the red category.

White Pool

Missourians 18+

If you are a Missourian 18 years of age or older and received at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine before July 21, 2021, you may register for a chance to win \$10,000 in the white category.

Blue Pool

Missourians 12 to 17

If you are a Missourian between the ages of 12 to 17, you may register for a chance to win a \$10,000 education savings account through the Missouri State Treasurer's MOST 529 program.

Drawing Timeline

Vaccinated individuals only need to enter one time to be eligible for all drawings that occur after the date their entry is received.
